Overview

M0220.300

Eligible immigration status is only one nonfinancial eligibility requirement.

- Noncitizens must still meet all other financial and nonfinancial requirements to be eligible for full-benefit Medicaid or FAMIS.
- Immigration status eligibility varies based on the age, pregnancy status, aid category and date of entry.
- If all eligibility requirements except immigration status are met, evaluate for emergency services or, if pregnant, FAMIS Prenatal.

Mandatory/Unrestricted Noncitizens

- Eligible with no waiting period and no limit based on the duration of presence in the U.S.
- Regardless of date of entry
- Must be legally residing

Continuous Presence

- A noncitizen who entered the U.S. before August 22, 1996 and gained qualifying status after that date must have been "continuously present" in the U.S. from the last date of entry prior to August 22, 1996 until they obtained qualified immigrant status.
 - If they were not continuously present during that time, use eligibility rules for those who entered after August 22, 1996.
 - Continuous presence is not required after the qualifying status was gained
- Continuously present in the U.S. means that they were not absent from the U.S. for 30 or more days at one time or for 90 or more days in total.
- Continuous presence cannot be verified via SAVE.

Certain Afghan Parolees M0220.000 Appendix 4

Due to the U.S. Evacuation of Afghanistan, federal legislation extended Medicaid eligibility to certain Afghan Parolees who would otherwise be ineligible.

- 1. Special Immigrant Parolees (SIP), granted Special Immigrant (SI/SQ) Parole who entered the United States between July 1, 2021 and September 30, 2023, including Unaccompanied Afghan Minors.
- 2. Humanitarian Parolees who entered the United States without SI/SQ parole due to the urgent nature of their arrival (Humanitarian status), who entered the United States between July 1, 2021 and September 30, 2023
- 3. Afghan SIPs or Humanitarian Parolees who are the spouses or children of eligible Afghan Parolees who entered between July 1, 2021 and September 30, 2023, even if they entered after September 30, 2023.
- 4. 4. Afghan SIPs or Humanitarian Parolees who are the parents or legal guardians unaccompanied Afghan minors who entered between July 1, 2021 and September 30, 2013, even if they entered after September 30, 2023.

Certain Ukrainian Parolees

M0220.000 Appendix 4

- Ukrainian nationals who enter the United States as parolees on or between February 24, 2022 and September 30, 2023 are eligible for Medicaid or CHIP to the same extent as refugees, without a five-year waiting period, if they meet other eligibility requirements.
- Ukrainian nationals who are paroled into the U.S. after September 30, 2023 and are the spouse or child of a parolee described above, or who is the parent, legal guardian, or primary caregiver of a parolee described above who is determined to be an unaccompanied child will also be eligible for Medicaid and CHIP to the same extent as refugees.



Eligibility for Certain Afghan and Ukrainian Parolees M0220.000 Appendix 4

- Eligibility continues until the parole expires
- Eligibility continues after the expiration of the period of parole if the individual was enrolled prior to the expiration of their parole period and have a pending re-parole application, asylum application, or adjustment of status application with USCIS.
- Must still meet all other Medicaid eligibility criteria
- If an Afghan of Ukrainian Parolee entered the U.S. outside of the defined period, eligibility should be determined using standard eligibility rules.
 - Adult Parolees who entered after 9/22/2996 have a 5-year bar.
 - Children and pregnant parolees are eligible with no bar.
- Those with another Qualifying immigration status (refugees, Special Immigrant Visa (SIV), or asylees), are eligible for Medicaid in the standard manner.
- Those with another legally residing status or no status should be determined in the standard manner.



Full-Benefit Child & Pregnant Noncitizens



Legally Residing Pregnant and Child Noncitizens M0220.314 Appendix 4

- Children under 19 and pregnant individuals must be legally residing
- Noncitizens are legally residing in the U.S. if they have been admitted lawfully into the U.S. and have not overstayed the period for which they were admitted *or* have current permission to stay or live in the U.S.

This is a broad category and includes most individuals with valid visas.

No time limit or waiting period

Non-exhaustive list

FAMIS Prenatal

- Full-benefit coverage for pregnant individuals who meet all eligibility criteria except immigration status.
- Coverage ends the last day of the month in which the 60th postpartum day occurs.
- SSN is not required
- Applicant must be uninsured
- No retroactive enrollment beyond month of application (still may be eligible for emergency services to cover the birth)
- Not eligible if application is submitted after the month of the birth (still may be eligible for emergency services to cover the birth)

- 110: Income <143% FPL
- 111: Income > 143% < 200%



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FAMIS Prenatal Infant Coverage

- Infants born to members enrolled in AC 110 in fee for service have labor and delivery services paid under emergency services and the infant is a deemed-eligible newborn.
- Infants born to members **enrolled in AC 111 or enrolled in AC 110 in managed care are not deemed-eligible newborn.** The infant's birth should be treated as an add a person case change. Do not require a new application.
 - If eligibility is confirmed, must be enrolled with a 12-month eligibility period
 - If eligibility cannot be confirmed, child must remain enrolled with a renewal date no earlier than 12 months from the date of the mother's enrollment in FAMIS Prenatal

Aid Categories:

- AC90: Income > 109% and < 143%
- AC91: Income < 109%
- AC006: Income >150% and < 200%
- AC008: Income > 143% and <u><</u> 150%



Infant Enrollment

- To determine eligibility for infants who are not deemed, the eligibility worker must have the information below obtained from the hospital or parent:
 - Name
 - Date of birth
 - Sex
- If the father was not included in the mother's MAGI household, do not request his information to determine the infant's eligibility unless it is known that he resides in the same home as the infant (i.e. from another program).
- Proof of application of a social security number is not required when determining eligibility for infant.
 - Follow up to get SSN at three months after birth. If no SSN has been issued, wait until renewal to obtain.

Emergency Services

- Noncitizens who meet Medicaid eligibility requirements except having an eligibility immigration status can still receive coverage for Emergency Services.
 - Legally residing individuals who are not eligible for Medicaid (ex. An adult LPR who has been present in the U.S. for 2 years) are also eligible for coverage and financial assistance through the Marketplace.
- Effective July 1, 2022, emergency services enrollees receive a 12-month eligibility period of emergency coverage.
- The Notice of Action will advise approved applicants of their eligibility for coverage, <u>limited to emergency services</u>, and their renewal date.
- A fact sheet will be included with additional information about the coverage.
- Emergency services enrollees do not receive a card and must use the Medicaid ID on the NOA.



Evaluation and Enrollment

- Individuals may apply and be enrolled in Emergency Services Medicaid prior to receiving and emergency service.
- An application received by the Local Department of Social Services (LDSS) will be evaluated without the need for additional upfront medical documentation.
- Claims are submitted by the provider directly to DMAS for evaluation if an emergency service is received.
- These cases will require an annual redetermination.

What Happens if I am Approved for Emergency Services?

If you are approved for Emergency Services coverage, you will only be covered for those services deemed medically necessary by your Medicaid benefit plan. The notice of coverage you receive will specify whether you have been approved for Emergency Services coverage and will tell you when your coverage starts and ends.

You will need to provide your Medicaid number to your provider after receiving a medical service. The provider will follow established protocol to identify what services were provided and submit a claim. Services reported by the provider must meet the criteria of Medicaid-approved emergency services in order to be covered by Medicaid. Additional information will also be given to providers.

The applicant is not required to provide immigration status information for Emergency Services through Medicaid.

Verifying Immigration Status

Immigrant's status must be verified using information from an official document issued by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS)

- Document information is compared with the Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements (SAVE) system.
- SAVE interfaces with the Federal Hub for applications in VaCMS
- EW does not need to obtain the immigrant status document when immigration status is verified through the Hub.



Immigration Status Primary Verification

Primary verification is the automated method of accessing the USCIS data bank.

- SAVE regulations require that automated access be attempted prior to initiating secondary verification.
- CMS regulation requires electronic verification be attempted prior to requesting documentation from applicant/member.
- Alien Registration Number
 - Begins with an A
 - Located on the individual's USCIS document(s) and/or provided on the application
- No negative action may be taken on the basis of the automated verification only.



Secondary Verification

M0220.206

Secondary verification is required in the following situations:

- Individual has an Alien number but no USCIS document
- Individuals has no Alien number and no USCIS document
- Primary verification generates the message "Institute Secondary Verification" or "No File Found."
- Discrepancies between data returned through the primary verification and the original immigration document/document information provided.
- Documents contain an A-Number in the A60 000 000 or A80 000 000 series.
- Document presented is an USCIS Fee Receipt.
- Document presented is Form I-181 or I-94 in a foreign passport that is endorsed "Processed for I-551, Temporary Evidence of Lawful Permanent Residence," and the I-181 or I-94 is more than one year old.



Secondary Verification Process

When secondary verification is required, the agency must:

- Complete the top portion of a Document Verification Request (Form G-845) or The G-845 is available at http://www.uscis.gov. Click on "Forms."
- Cnitiate an on-line request for a secondary verification through SAVE.





Immigration Status Not Verified

- If verification of identity and/or immigration status is not made, the individual is considered an unqualified noncitizen
 - Emergency Services
 - FAMIS Prenatal
- If the individual has been verified to meets all eligibility requirements except immigration status, SSN, and/or identity they must be given a Reasonable Opportunity Period to provide additional documentation.



Reasonable Opportunity Periods

Individuals who attest to one of the below and meet all other eligibility requirements must be enrolled without delay and given a 90-day reasonable opportunity period (ROP) to provide outstanding verifications.

- Citizenship & Identity
- Lawful Immigration Status
- Possession of SSN without knowledge of the number or willingness to apply for an SSN.

Coverage should be closed, with advanced notice, if verification has not been received by the end of the 90th day.

An additional ROP can be granted of the individual has shown good faith effort to obtain the necessary documents.

Continuous Eligibility protections do not apply to children and pregnant individuals enrolled with an ROP.



Non-Financial Requirements-Residency

Residency

M220.500.A.1 & M230.00.C

- Regardless of the individual's immigration status *or whether or not his documentation* (*e.g. visa*) has expired, accept declaration of Virginia residency on the application as verification of residency.
- Do NOT require individuals who have been admitted into the U.S. on non-immigrant visas and other nonimmigrants to sign a statement of intended residency.

Social Security Numbers (SSN)

M220.500

- Do not verify for emergency services or Prenatal FAMIS if the applicant attests to not having eligible immigration status.
- A noncitizen who is only eligible to receive a SSN for a valid-nonwork reason and would only need one to apply for Medicaid should not be required to provide or apply for an SSN. For example, a student visa holder who does not intend to work.



Form Number	Description
I-797, Notice of Action	Issued to communicate receipt or approval of an application or petition.
I-797A, Notice of Action	Issued to an applicant as a replacement Form I-94.
I-797B, Notice of Action	Issued for approval of a noncitizen worker petition.
I-797C, Notice of Action	Issued to communicate receipt or rejection of an applications or petitions; transfer of files; fingerprint biometric, interview and re-scheduled appointments; additional actions, and re- opening of cases.
I-797D	Accompanies benefit cards.
I-797E, Notice of Action	Issued to request evidence.
I-797F, Transportation Letter	Issued overseas to allow applicants to travel.



1. <u>CMS Proposed Rule: Clarifying Eligibility for a QHP Through an Exchange, APTC, CSRs, a BHP, and for Some Medicaid and CHIP programs (aka DACA Rule)</u>

- Redefines certain immigration statuses as "legally residing"

 - Applicants for Adjustment to LPR status, even if the underlying visa has expired

 - Applicants for asylum, withholding of removal and relieve under Convention Against Torture
- Only changes Medicaid and CHIP eligibility for children and pregnant noncitizens with these statuses
